You could argue that Group Policy is in fact the main reason why so many organizations use active directory to manage their networks, and that's because, being able to centrally control computer and user settings without having to write any scripts is an enormous benefit for IT departments. Now group policy is a vast topic but the strategy in this course is to cover what you need to know for the exam as efficiently as possible.
